Inside Crochet



Embroidered Crochet

Anna Nikipirowicz • Search Press, £12.99 • UK terminology



•> We're very excited about this beautiful new book from regular Inside Crochet designer Anna Nikipirowicz, which combines crochet with embroidery. Crochet fabric made using double crochet creates a firm, dense base for surface stitching, enabling you to embellish home accessories with striking designs that still have the tactile quality of crochet. Anna provides a basic introduction to the materials, tools

and techniques you'll need for both crochet and embroidery, before launching into the fun part – 10 gorgeous projects to make. Each project starts with the crochet pattern, and is followed by detailed instructions for the embroidery design, including a transfer or chart. Transfers can simply be cut out and ironed on to your crochet, just as you would for embroidery on fabric.

There are so many must-make projects in this book. From a practical shopping bag hooked in a super-chunky yarn with chevron stripes worked on top in equally chunky embroidery, to the whimsical Wild Garden Pillow Set embellished with delicate floral motifs and finished with corner pompoms. Decorations include the Wildflower Wall Hanging and the Woodland Pennant Garland featuring on-trend toadstools and forest creatures in cross-stitch crochet, and a Roses Basket Set adorned with blooms that could be used for everything from yarn storage to plants.

Embroidered Crochet is an exquisite collection of projects that will bring an exciting new dimension to your crochet.

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To celebrate the release of A Knitter's Year we caught up with author Ida Wirak Trettevik to learn more about her creative process for knitting a wardrobe of versatile, sustainable styles to wear all year round.

I live in central Oslo with my husband and three boys aged 11, eight and six. I make a living designing knitted garments and patterns, and run my own company Witre Design. It's a real "one-woman show", and I have done it full-time for the past four years. Having created my own workplace, entirely from my creative thoughts and processes, gives me a lot. I am so grateful that others like what I do so that I can continue to share my passion, and be able to be a part of giving others a good knitting experience.

A Knitter's Year was published in Norway at the very beginning of my design journey in 2020. In addition to the fact that we (me and my family) lived for a year on an island in the northern part of Norway the year I wrote it, which has made it a more personal book than what was intended, it shows so much of what happened that year.

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Both my process as a designer and the change we had with moving, are shown in the pictures. We had lived in Oslo for several years, and had always been attracted to doing something completely different together as a family; going on adventures, having a shared experience around something completely new, and spending more time together. And that all happened on Engeløya that same year.

Since we lived there, right by the sea, with the midnight sun and raw Norwegian nature right outside the door, we decided that the book had to contain this. So the photographer flew from Oslo, and the last photos in the book were taken there. The book is also personal in that it is my children who are included, in our surroundings both in Oslo and in the north, and in many ways, it has been as

much the pictures as the text in the book that have made it so valuable to work with.



I have always been fond of clothes, especially vintage and second-hand, in addition, I have knitted for a long time. I learned to knit early and have knitted clothes for myself and my children, on and off for years. Being able to decide colors and fibres entirely myself, knit freehand, and create garments that no one else has has always given me an enormous sense of freedom. Then there are no rules. There is no one who can decide how it will turn out, apart from me. And I like that. As soon as it becomes too neat or mainstream, something in me wants to shake it up a bit, find some of the little flaws or details that make it different, and highlight it. It's so boring if everyone is exactly the same. So being able to be a voice that talks about clothes. but that the focus is on the process and the personal journey that is in each garment, and through handwork, is one of the things that pulls me in the direction I am in now.

My inspiration comes a lot from the streets of Oslo. I like to see how other people put together clothes and accessories or different colours. I take small details with me and into a pattern, and then develop a new garment based on several impressions. Everything I make are garments I want to wear myself. In order for Witre to be an inspiring universe

for me to work in, it has been important to maintain that joy, the joy of making garments that make me happy to see and wear.

My all-time favourite season for knitting is summer. A season in which I think many people don't knit, because one associates knitting with warm fibres and thick garments. Summer clothes are nice in many ways. They are often small and easy to take with you. Fibres such as cotton and linen are inexpensive compared to other fibres. You'll finish it fast, compared to a large sweater, because a top is smaller. And it's so fun to combine with other clothes in my wardrobe. There are many ways and days to use them. I find that very motivating.

Where I get to knit the most is when we are out driving. Being on a trip in new surroundings and there are no other distractions, and I can completely disconnect and knit.




