Sally lives in Teesdale, County Durham, UK.

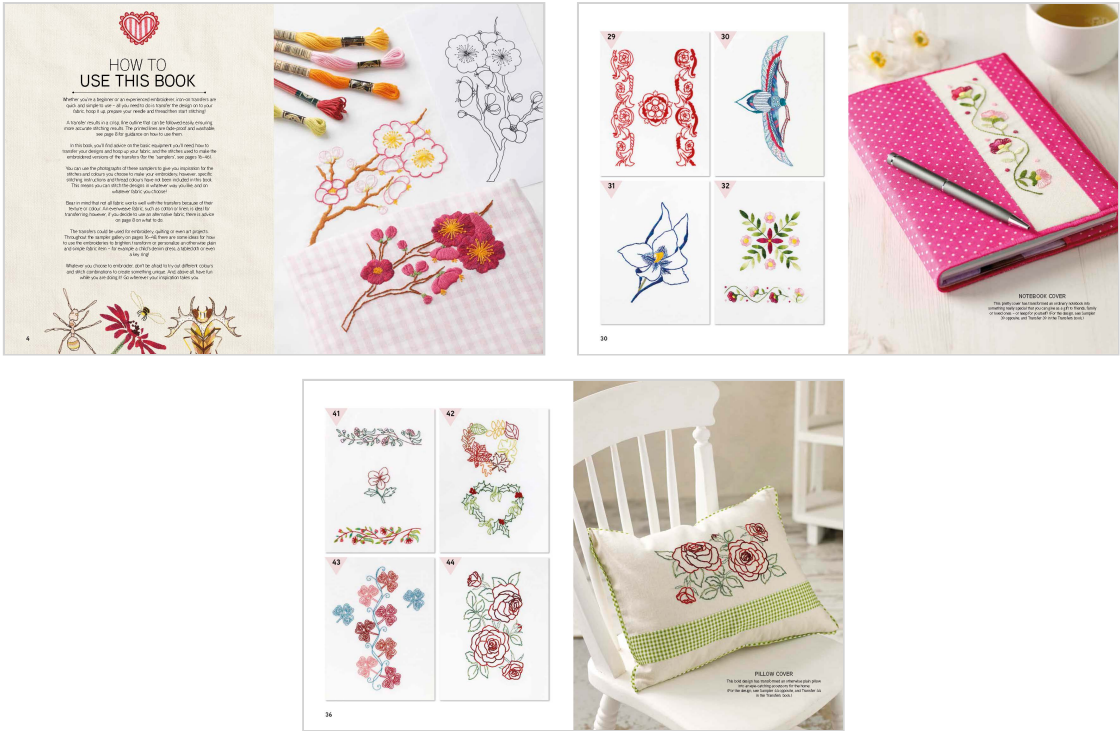
