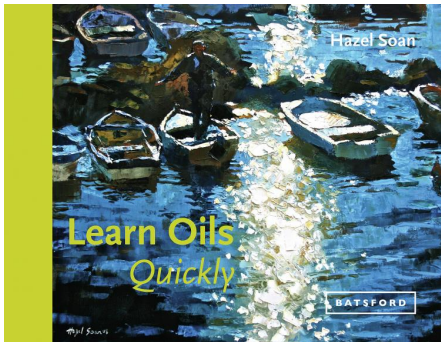

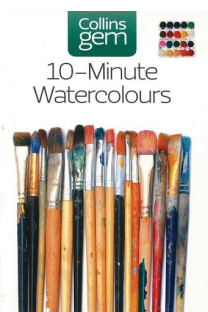

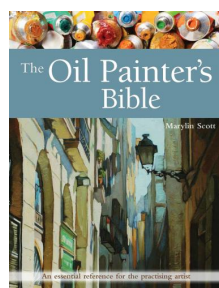
## About The Author

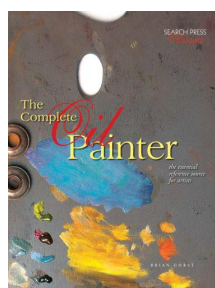
